## CHARGING OF DISPOSAL FEES AT MUNICIPAL LANDFILL SITES

The charging of disposal fees at municipal disposal sites was implemented on 1 February 2010 and approximately 150 landfill users are registered on our database comprising of local businesses, municipal contractors, non-residents and garden service companies and are provided with a sticker for access into the landfill sites.

Midvaal residents who are not engaged in business activities are hereby reminded to produce a copy of their municipal services account when entering municipal landfill sites and transfer stations. No access into the municipal disposal sites will be granted without proof of the services account.

Non-residents and businesses will not be permitted into the landfill sites without the required sticker/permit.

## POLICING OF ILLEGAL DUMPING, LITTER AND WASTE MANAGEMENT BY-LAW ENFORCEMENT

A service provider will be appointed from 1 April 2010 for a period of four (4) months to police illegal dumping, litter and enforcement of waste management by-laws with an objective to reduce illegal dumping and littering. This project is part of the municipal capacity building programme to support the disposal fee system implemented on our disposal sites. The latter will assist in the conviction of offenders.

The service provider will render the following services:

- The policing of illegal dumping and littering in and around municipal landfill sites, transfer stations and open spaces most prone to illegal dumping.
- Issuing of spot fines to offenders.
- Appearance in the magistrates courts (if applicable) to defend cases on behalf of Midvaal.
- Enforcement of Waste Management By-Laws.
- Work very closely with the SAPS in the investigation of environmental crimes.
- Investigation of illegal dumping complaints by members of the public.
